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MOUTOHORĀ: ISLAND SANCTUARY

Moutohorā (Whale Island) is one of New Zealand's hidden gems – a pest-free oasis that is home to endangered native birds and reptiles.

Learn about the island from passionate local tour guides, many of whom have helped with the regeneration of Moutohorā.

Many of the operators give back to the organisations that help protect the island. If you choose to visit with Moutohorā: Island Sanctuary tours, you'll be supporting the continued protection of Moutohorā and its surrounding waters as a portion of your ticket price will go to both the Department of Conservation and to the Whakatāne Coastguard.

Book a native tree planting experience with Te Urewera Treks and do your part to help regenerate the Te Urewera Forest.

Choose from Rimu, Totara, Matai or native beech seedlings that in 1,000 years will be fully developed members of the podocarp and beech forests that dominate the Urewera region.

Your part in the restoration of this very special landscape gives you status as Kaitiaki Tautoko, or honorary guardian of the forest.

The guides from KG Kayaks have been operating in the Eastern Bay for almost 20 years. They are involved with pest control initiatives and the regeneration of native plants.

EAST COAST PADDLER

Immerse yourself in Māori culture and stories with the crew from East Coast Paddler.

Take a guided hikoi (walk) around Mauao (Mount Maunganui) and learn about current environmental efforts to keep Mauao and the surrounding ocean waters pristine. Look out for marine life as you enjoy the beauty of this stunning coastal walk – one of the most popular short walks in New Zealand.

At the end of the hikoi, you will receive a brief poroporoaki (farewell) at the beach station, where you will be given a traditional handcrafted gift followed by the freshest local fish and chips.
